As the holidays approach and as I think over some recent events in my life, I am reminded of Christmas time at my Grandma Bertis' when I was a young boy. Each year on Christmas Eve, the whole Fordham clan would

gather at her small country home in Hopeulikit, Georgia. As I walked into her home, the smell of all the good food that had been prepared would overwhelm me. I would take a deep breath, not to smell the food, but to get ready to run the gauntlet of all the ribbing from uncles and of those hugs and kisses from aunts. If you tried to run, one of the uncles would block your path. Aunts that grew up hoeing cotton, tobacco, and washing clothes in a wash pot and wringing them out by hand developed a strong grip! They had a grip! There was no escape. They all had on fresh lipstick and the power to hug like an anaconda squeezing its prey. It was awful. My face looked like a clown and my poor little body was crushed by "lipstick- wearing anacondas." One good thing about it, Grandma was waiting on the other end. If I could just make it to Grandma! Grandma would always say, "All right now, ya'll have done enough, turn my boy loose!" Finally! I am in Grandma's arms! She would hug and kiss me. She always gave me a Christmas gift that I needed (usually a pair of socks). Grandma loved me and I loved her! Looking back, going through the gauntlet wasn't really that bad. Over the years, I came to enjoy those hugs and kisses.
