Matthew 28:19-20: *"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you."*

The Lord Jesus instructs us to share our faith with others. But we often over complicate this task. Sharing our faith isn't as hard as we

make it. We don't necessarily have to prepare a great sermon and stand before a large crowd to share our faith. In fact it's not as much what you say that will make the biggest impact; but what you do. It has often been said that the greatest sermon is lived out, everyday. The way you conduct yourself, the words that you say, the clothes you wear--all tell of your faith. I like to say it like this, "You can tell people what you think, but you will show them what you believe."

Other than living it out, I have found that one of the easiest ways to share your faith is by using gospel tracts. Gospel tracts are not intimidating. They don't get cold feet or forget what to say. Use gospel tracts that catch the eye and are attractive. You want tracts that make people want to pick them up and read them. Make sure you know and agree with what they say. I like to use tracts that look like money. Ruffle up the edges and let them hang out your back pocket. People will constantly point to you. They bring it up--then you can start talking. You say, "No, it's a gospel tract--it looks like money on one side and the other side talks about Jesus and how to get to heaven." They will typically start laughing and apologize, then you say, "No, it's ok, thank you for pointing it out, here I'd like you to have it." You may want to explain that you have a lot of them and that you hand them out on purpose, with the intention to hand them out to all who ask about it. If you are feeling uncomfortable, ask them, "Where do you go to church?" Let the spirit lead. It gets easier every time you do it. Practice on yourself a couple of times.

You don't have to say a word. I like to use one that looks like an invitation to a party and leave them in restaurants and restrooms, next to the sink or trash can. People will usually look at it to see what the occasion is and when they do they see the gospel. You can also leave them with tips in them at restaurants. You can also get tracts that look like credit cards and leave them in ATM machines, debit card machines, or gas pumps where others are likely to come up and see them. I also like to put a scratch off gospel tract near lottery counters in stores. There are gospel tracts for everyone and they come in every shape and size. Use your imagination.

Finally, we must always be prepared to share the gospel. The gospel is for EVERYONE, EVERYWHERE. It doesn't change from person to person or take sick days and vacations. One message, One faith, One salvation. JESUS SAVES!!! John 3:16 says "For God so loved the world, that He gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

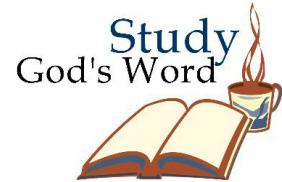
