It has taken two years to get here, and I know it will be worth the wait. God always has a plan, and His timing is always perfect. #### **Helpful Terms to Know**

<u>Chrysalis</u>--the youth and young adult version of the Walk to Emmaus. This is for ages 15-18 and is geared toward high school students. The "caterpillars" take their "flights" in June. Girls go one weekend and the boys go the next weekend. The Chrysalis flights in our area take place at Tattnall Campground.

<u>Journey</u>.--the young adult version of the Walk to Emmaus. This is for ages 19-24 and is geared toward college age young adults. These "caterpillars" take their "flights" in February of each year. Girls go one weekend ahead of the boys. The Journey flights take place at Tattnall Campground.

<u>Walks</u>--the adult Walk to Emmaus weekends. The adult "walks" of "Pilgrims" take place twice a year. The Spring Walks take place in March and the Fall Walks take place in September. The Men's Walk takes place ahead of the Women's Walk. The Walks for our area take place at Tattnall Campground.

### A Few Gentle Reminders for the Community

\*Send-Off is a bit subdued by Emmaus standards. We try to be more reserved as the Pilgrims are nervous and it is a new situation for them.

\*It is appropriate to wear your name badges to all Emmaus occasions. It is the kindest way for folks to learn your name. You are welcome to wear

your *cross* to all events with the *exception* of Send-Off and Candlelight. Feel free to wear them at Closing on Sunday. We like to keep with the pace of the pilgrims. Basically, we don't wear our crosses until the pilgrims receive theirs.

\*Be sure to stay for Sponsor's Hour following Send-Off.

\*Baskets will be available at the back of the tabernacle during Sponsor's Hour and the time which we gather for Candlelight. Please put your letters you have gathered for pilgrims in the baskets. On the envelopes, write both the pilgrim's FIRST and LAST name in the center of every letter envelope. In the top left hand corner put the title of your relationship to the pilgrim (brother, sister, spouse, friend, church member, etc). Each pilgrim should receive 12 letters during the walk-any beyond that will be put in the "go home" bag as a Fourth Day gift. You may also number them 1-12 and secure them with a rubber band as the ones to be read in Conference Room.

\*Please bring your table agape and baked agape to Send-Off if possible. It will be truly appreciated. Please take to back Kitchen door.

VERY IMPORTANT!

\*When you arrive for Candlelight, please park with your HEADLIHGTS FACING AWAY from the TABERNACLE.

\*Candlelight is a precious and heavenly time for worship in the Emmaus/Journey/Chrysalis weekends. And, although we hold that Emmaus is not a secret society and only truth should be told, we do like to reserve Candlelight as a special surprise blessing. Since it is a truly touching time, we ask that only people who have gone on an Emmaus/Chrysalis/ Journey attend Candlelight. We would never want to diminish that experience for a potential pilgrim or butterfly in the future.

Young people attend only if they have attended Chrysalis or Journey.

\*Remember that Candlelight belongs to God and the Pilgrims. Try to refrain from reaching out to pilgrims as they pass. Candlelight is different for everyone and they should be allowed to find their own way. If they spot you and come for a hug, do receive them with open arms, tell them you love them and then gently nudge them back on their journey down the path.

\*Once you have passed through the line of pilgrims for the final time at Candlelight, extinguish your candle, and please leave the campground quietly and silently. Towns close by offer establishments in which you can gather for more fellowship.

\*Childcare is not provided for Send-Off, Candlelight, or Closing. You will want to plan accordingly.

\*The Closing is many things, one of which is celebratory. Feel free to dress in rainbow colors and wear your crosses!

\*No event during the Walk weekend activities should be photographed, videotaped, or recorded by any means by any worker or community member. We need to preserve the integrity of all aspects of the Walk to Emmaus as well as keep our covenant with the Upper Room.

\*Please plan to attend the PIO Party/Sustaining the Spirit to celebrate the new Pilgrims on Friday, September 23, at 7:00 p.m. at the Campground. Childcare is not provided for PIO Party and remember it is our privilege to host the Pilgrims with our covered dishes.

Sustaining the Spirit will be held on the same night as the PIO Party. We will eat. While the Community cleans up, the PILGRIMS AND THEIR SPONSORS will go to the Tabernacle to hear an overview of the Emmaus process. If you have never been to Sustaining the Spirit please plan to attend also. You learn the correct process of Sponsorship and the importance of working Walks before you sponsor someone.
