As we approach this Christmas season, we will celebrate the birth of our Savior. His gift of salvation is the greatest gift that God gave to us. One of the greatest earthly gifts that I have ever received was being sponsored to go on the Walk to Emmaus by two very special ladies from our church. It was a gift that continues to give to me every day of my life. I do admit that I went very reluctantly. After all, I was thinking, "how is a blind man going to manage on this "Walk weekend?" My wife wanted to go and I didn't think she could go unless I went ahead of her. God always goes before us and little did I know what God had in store for me!

Many years ago a lady from an organization to assist blind people came to our home and delivered a white cane. She instructed me how to use it. She also instructed Ann and I how to walk, maneuver through crowds, cross streets, etc. When I went on the Walk to Emmaus #66 in 2009, I had never used the white cane in public. I don't know why I hadn't used it. It was either my vanity or I was just ashamed, but basically I didn't want people to know that I was blind. Something told me to put the white cane in my bag as I packed for my "Walk weekend." On my Walk, I felt so much love and the men around me didn't pity me or feel sorry for me. They accepted me as I was and helped and supported me in every way. Dr. Jimmy High was the music technician on that Walk and he was also assigned to "look after me." I have always referred to him since as "my angel on High." From the Walk on, I started to use my white cane. Since then, I have used it without any sense of embarrassment for my disability.

The Walk made many other differences in my life. Since the Walk, God put a burden on my heart to share and tell how good He has been to me. God has always been there for me, but I had never put Him front and center of my life as I should have. God provided people on my Walk who have become close friends. They have mentored and taught me so much about walking close to God daily. I was not the student of the Bible as I should

have been and since then I have been more intentional about studying and growing in God's grace and knowledge. Prior to the Walk, I did not have the consistent prayer life that I should have. God has shown me how important it is to seek Him first in the morning. Since the Walk, my wife and I pray together each morning as we seek His guidance and offer thanksgiving and intercessory prayer for each other, our children, grandchildren, our church, needs of others, and our world. In 2007, my wife and I experienced our life's greatest challenge and the deepest valley when we lost a son in a tragic automobile accident. The Walk experience strengthened us both in our faith that has helped us to continue to heal and deal with that loss.

In 2010, I was asked to be an assistant table leader on the upcoming Walk and give a talk--I was very apprehensive at first. God provided the help I needed. I worked many Walks--God always sent brothers in Christ to assist and help me while working. I was blessed beyond measure to be the Lay Director on Walk #86! Emmaus continues to bless me in many ways--attending Gatherings, fellowshiping with the body of Christ, praising through music, as well as working Walks. Going on the Walk totally changed my walk with the Lord. I can never repay the Emmaus community for what they have given to me. I have a Great God and great wife that looks after me--what more could I ask for! I hope that the Body of Christ has blessed each of you as it has me.
