

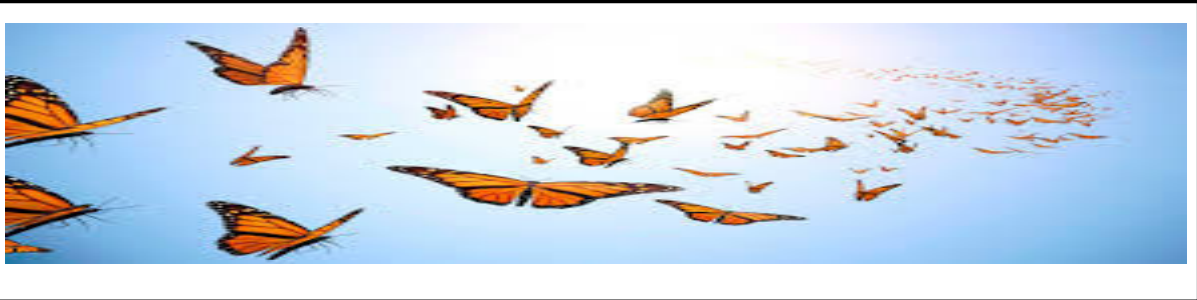

"My Walk to Emmaus Weekend was the beginning of my believing that I could be loved and accepted just as I am, no expectations, no strings attached. It was the first time in a very long time that I had laughed so hard. It was the beginning of the freedom to be myself. And, as I continued to work weekends, God continued to grow me and stretch me. The extremely shy and introverted servant who experienced extreme anxiety at Send Off and Newfound Friends is now feeling much more at ease and leaning to "chit chat".

And, it was the beginning of my understanding of God's Prevenient Grace. As I look back, I can see the hand of God working as the very desires of my heart that had been there for as long as I can remember began to become a reality - playing the guitar, playing the drums, singing and playing with a music group, and delivering the "mini-sermons" God gave me throughout the years when I would get quiet and still. The answered prayer in the Spring of 2013 as I cried out to God to give me the ability to be able to sing while also playing the drums so that I could do the two things I loved most. And then, there are the people and experiences He has placed in my life: the table leader who planted the seed that I would one day be playing with the Emmaus musicians; the Emmaus musician who welcomed me and encouraged me to join them; the job that took me to the local state prison once a quarter; and the drum teacher in the office building where I worked who taught me the basic techniques of playing the Djembe.

As I look back, I can see how God used my Emmaus weekend and subsequent servant weekends to get me ready for the next ministry opportunity - Kairos Prison Ministry. When I received the invitation to join the Kairos team and work on the music team, I accepted without hesitation because of the music opportunity. However, after each team meeting, I found myself telling God that I wasn't going back. Suddenly I was way outside my comfort zone and I wanted to quit. When the announcement came that the weekend could not be held if any more team members dropped, I acquiesced. I went into the weekend thinking that God would work through me to reach these ladies, and He did. And, in the process, He used the Kairos Weekend and the participants to change me. I remember my very first Kairos team meeting and it being said that we couldn't hug the participants. "No problem here," I thought. By that Saturday morning, I was weeping because I could not hug these precious daughters of God. For the first time in my life, I knew what it felt like for the love of God to flow through me in spite of myself. I'm not the same person I was in the Spring of 2013. There is a love inside of me that I have never experienced before. I've worked a total of seven weekends thus far and God has used each one of them to change

me, to grow me, to stretch me. I am so grateful for God's Preventive Grace that has brought me to this place and so humbled that He would choose me to join others to carry the torch for Christ into Emanuel Womens Facility.

The Kairos Prison Ministry weekend is similar but different from an Emmaus weekend. It starts on Thursday afternoon and goes through closing on Sunday afternoon. Each team member sponsors one of the participants for the weekend and is responsible for raising the required funds to support their sponsoree. There are talks given throughout the weekend. Each Table Family discusses the talks and creates posters as their creative summary. Seated at each Table Family is a table leader, an assistant table leader, a clergy, and six participants. At Emanuel Womens Facility in Swainsboro, food is brought in from the local restaurants. Out-of-town team members stay at the local hotel. We are always looking for more servants to join us as we are still in the growing phase of this ministry. We have grown from serving 18 participants to 30 participants. The maximum number of participants for a weekend is 42. The number of participants is based on the size of the team. If you are interested in joining us, we have a number of Dayspring Emmaus Community members active in this ministry at Emanuel Womens Facility who would be more than happy to answer any questions. They are: Robin Kersey, Vivian Losser, Vicky Riggins, Lynn Joyner, Theresa Craft, Teresa Deaton, Connie Hayes, Claire Dyches, Nancy Mylar, Mary Katherine Banks, Cindy Russell, Nan Wallace, and Barbara Mosley.

If going into the prison does not appeal to you, there are a number of other ways to support this ministry: contributing financially, purchasing meals for the participants, coloring placemats, creating posters, praying for the weekend, or baking cookies. Just let any of us know if you would like to get involved."
